


What does the community value?

SMALL NEIGHBORHOOD SCHOOLS where there is a strong sense of community.



THE QUALITY OF EDUCATION students receive both through rigorous academic standards and enrichment.



60% DO NOT SEE COMMUNITY VALUES IN DECISION MAKING.

88% DISSATISFIED by the **decision-making** of district leadership.

91% DISSATISFIED by the district leadership's handling of the balancing the budget.

What has been missing from the budget conversation?

COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND TRANSPARENCY

There is a desire for clearer communication from the district regarding budget decisions, expenditures, and the rationale behind them.

X CENTRAL ADMINISTRATION CUTS

Respondents called for cuts to these positions rather than programs directly serving students and questioned the high proportion of budget allocated to the district office.

EXPLORING ALTERNATIVES TO SCHOOL CLOSURES

There was a consensus that school closures should be a last resort and that other options have yet be thoroughly explored.

How to balance the budget?

*** IMPLEMENTING PERSONNEL CUTS FURTHEST FROM STUDENTS**

Reducing positions within the district office and salary cuts to central administration were a common theme.

***** APPLYING FOR STATE AND FEDERAL GRANTS

*** EXPANDING REVENUE GENERATION**

Preschool classrooms in every neighborhood school, facility rentals, and seeking partnerships with local organizations and businesses.

X LOBBYING STATE GOVERNMENT

The community is ready to help lobby for both increased state funding and restructuring funding mechanisms to better suit all sizes of districts.

X COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT AND TRANSPARENCY

Crucial to ensure diverse perspectives are considered.

X PROGRAM EVALUATION AND ADJUSTMENT

There was a consensus on the need to evaluate educational program effectiveness and cost efficiency, with proposals to expand successful programs and reassess the viability of others.

*** FOCUS ON ACADEMIC PRIORITIES**

A substantial number of respondents stressed the importance of prioritizing academic programs and student needs over non-essential initiatives to attract families back to public schools.

Where should future efforts be focused?

****COMMUNITY INVOLVEMENT AND VOLUNTEERING**

Helping community members, including parents, retirees, and local businesses, to get more involved in schools through volunteering, mentoring, and supporting school events and activities.

*** SUPPORT FOR TEACHERS AND STAFF**

Supporting teachers and staff through adequate resources, fair compensation, and recognition for their efforts.

***ADVOCACY FOR FUNDING**

Advocating for increased funding for schools, either through legislative action or community initiatives. This includes supporting levies and bonds, lobbying for state funding, and exploring fundraising opportunities.

*** EQUITY AND INCLUSION**

Fostering equity in education, including access to resources, support for students with special needs, and addressing disparities across schools and student populations.

***COMMUNICATION AND TRANSPARENCY**

Improving communication between the district, schools, families, and the community.

*** EMPHASIS ON ACADEMIC EXCELLENCE**

Maintaining a focus on academic excellence while also addressing social and emotional needs. This includes supporting programs like music, arts, STEM education, and providing additional academic support where needed.
